

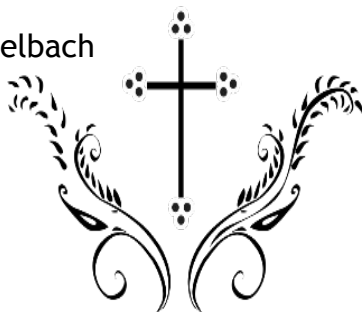

WE ARE CALLED TO BE "WATCHMEN"

Since Roe v. Wade, 60 million babies --- created in the image of God --- have been silently put to death before they were even born. There was no cry for help, there was no public outrage, and no trumpet sounded to warn the women who felt like abortion was their only option. As Christians, we are called to be the "watchmen".

"But if the watchman sees the sword coming and does not blow the trumpet to warn the people and the sword comes and takes the life of one of them, that man will be taken away because of his sin, but I will hold the watchman accountable for his blood" (Eze:33:6).

Not everyone is equipped to counsel women in the delicate situation of "an unplanned pregnancy." But we can all do something.

This the the human rights issue of our time. We cannot plead ignorance or remain apathetic.

"So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin." (James 4:17)

As Christians, we cannot and should not sit idly by and accept this massive slaughter of the innocents. We are called to be the "watchmen" of our brothers and sisters who are defenseless, voiceless and by far the most vulnerable in our society.
