

**LOCAL KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS TO SPONSOR YOUTH FREE THROW CHAMPIONSHIP**

All boys and girls ages 9 to 14 are invited to participate in the local level of competition for the 2019 Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship. The local competition will be held, Sunday, 3 Feb 2019 at the Kittson Central High School Gymnasium. The Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship is sponsored annually, with winners progressing through local, district, and state competitions. International champions are announced by the K of C international headquarters based on scores from the state-level competitions. All boys and girls 9 to 14 years old are eligible to participate and will compete in their respective age divisions. Last year more than 120,000 sharpshooters participated in over 3,600 local competitions. All contestants on the local are recognized for their participation in the event. The Knight of Columbus is an international Catholic family fraternal service organization with over 1.8 million members in 15,000 local councils. **DEACON CANDIDATE'S CORNER**

**Q.** - What are "faculties", and why does a bishop give them to deacons?

**A.** - One source defines faculties as "grants of jurisdiction or authorization made by church law or by a competent superior to perform ministerial acts such as hearing confessions, officiating at weddings, granting dispensations." In other words, "faculties" describe the specific authority a priest or deacon has to exercise certain functions, and all priests and deacons must have faculties from the diocesan bishop. For example, if a deacon moves from one diocese to another, he will need to request faculties from the new bishop in order to function on a regular basis in the diocese.

A deacon's faculties normally include functions such as celebrating baptisms, weddings, funerals, and prayer services; proclaiming the Gospel and preaching at Mass and other occasions; and performing other functions described in canon and liturgical law.
