This Sunday we celebrate the feast of the baptism of Jesus. It is a good day to reflect on our own baptism and its significance for us.

The day of Jesus' baptism was a defining moment in his

life; it was a day of new beginning. On that day he began his public ministry during which he gave himself fully in the service of God and all of God's people.

The Lord keeps calling out to us from the moment of our baptism. Our response to the Lord's call, the Lord's word, can be slow in coming, but his call, his word, remains powerfully creative and will in some way or other make of us what God wants for us.
