PASTOR'S PEN

Greetings in Christ Jesus!

This Sunday's is one of those Gospel readings that show you what a Gospel is for, why the Gospels are there at all. Jesus' encounters with other people are not just told because they happened.

Take this incident of the rich young man. This young man comes up to Jesus. He's a good, solid, upright, well-instructed, devout young Jew. That's clear from the conversation with Jesus.

Jesus reminds him of the Ten Commandments which then, as now, were the bases of a good life. The young man replies very simply: these he has kept from his earliest youth. Not a boast. Just stating a straightforward matter of fact.

There's no suggestion that Jesus either disbelieves or disapproves of what he says or the way he says it. Quite the contrary. He looked steadily at him and loved him. Loved him for his uncomplicated integrity, his sheer basic goodness. But this goodness is not enough. There is one thing you lack. Here comes the bombshell. Go, sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come and follow me.

Being good is not a sufficient condition for being a disciple of Jesus. Indeed, in the first place it's not even a necessary condition. There's something even more fundamental than goodness and without this 'something' that's even more basic than goodness, you can't even get started on the journey to the Kingdom Jesus proclaimed.

In the case of the rich young man, it was literal riches that filled in the emptiness that should have been there. In our case, it may be another kind of riches. It may be intellectual riches, it may be emotional riches.

In each case we make a false claim to be able to cope with anything in life. To buy our way out of situations, to talk our way out of situations, or to charm our way out of situations. And this is what has to be cleared away before we can become disciples.
