PASTOR'S PEN

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Reading this letter written by a child could not hold me back from sharing it with you as we welcome winter, joyfully or grudgingly, this year:

“Dear Winter,

I am tired. I have no more fight left in me. My spirit is weak, and boots are spoiled. I DON TIRE O! All I have to give you is my dignity, but I think you took that in January when I had to put on 3 pairs of pants, 4 pairs of socks, 2 sweaters, 2 hats, 3 gloves and one giant North Face coat to be remotely warm. I have nothing left, Winter and like TLC said, I ain't too proud to beg. Please go”.

It always seems so strange to me how ‘winter’ comes far before the seasons officially change. This is precisely why I feel that winter is just so long. It really is! At least the winter weather.

Last year I decided I ought to find a way to enjoy the winter since it took up so much of our year. I am still working on it, but winter and I are now on much better terms.

It's not only winter we welcome but also a new liturgical season in November. The liturgical calendar for the year 2022 is coming to an end. We are two Sundays away from entering into the Advent Season and a new liturgical calendar.

The central theme of Sunday's readings is the “Second Coming” of Jesus in glory, as Judge, at the end of the world. When Jesus said, “By your endurance you will gain your souls” [Lk. 21:19] He was referring to the suffering that the early Church Christian had to undergo following the crucifixion and death of Christ and His Glorious Resurrection. He was warning His followers that some families would be divided because some would accept Christ as their Savior while others would not. Consequently, those who believed in Jesus as their Savior would endure the death of martyrs. Others, fearing death, fearing losing name, fame, companions, or unhappy with church teachings would renounce their faith and disown Jesus as their Savior.

Some of us do not have very heavy crosses to bear. Our lives have been pretty good, filled with blessings from the Lord. But we have some brothers and sisters who do have very heavy crosses to bear. From day to day, they persist in their living faith in Christ, not knowing if, because they are Catholics, will be shot tomorrow, or if they will be slaughtered as lambs by the religious extremists. Indeed, the cross is very heavy for many to bear. And we must pray for them and pray for one another that we all endure until the end so we will gain our souls.
