## PASTOR'S PEN

Greetings in Christ Jesus!

On this Sunday, we celebrate the final consummation at the end of time. The readings of this Sunday are set in a prophetic tone. In other words, they point to the future deliverance of the people of God through Christ's redemptive work.

The readings also remind us of the glorious seasons that are ahead of us. Most importantly, this Sunday the holy mother church raises our hope of salvation, by reminding us of our future and eternal perfection through Christ's single sacrifice.

In our first reading from the book of prophet Daniel tells us that the Archangel Michael is the divine figure who protects our dignity. He is the great prince who mounts guard over us. There are two points to note here. The first is the important role of Archangel Michael.

Second, "all those whose names are found written in the book will be saved." In other words, they are the ones marked for eternal perfection through the sacrifice and blood of Christ.

Our second reading from the letters to the Hebrews continues to highlight the efficacy of the sacrifice of Christ for our salvation. It is a sacrifice which marks all believers with a bold sign of: "forgiven, acquitted, and sealed for salvation."

In today's gospel, Jesus employed different natural causes in order to remind us of the need to be on the guard for his great coming. The tone of his message moves from the prophecy of the great tribulation to the prophecy of the coming of the Son of man.

Hence, the central point of Christ's message is that no one knows when this time or moment would be. This reading equally, reminds us that Christ is a prophet, as well as our savior.

Also, by asserting that chaos will precede his coming, is simple to say that nothing will be able to stop what God has destined to happen. So, with confidence in the Lord who is to come, let us joyfully proclaim with the Psalmist: "You are my inheritance, O Lord"
