## PASTOR'S PEN

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The gospel accounts of last weekend, this weekend and next weekend are all taken from the 24th and 25th chapters of St. Matthew. The teachings are Jesus's final testament to his disciples, intended to guide them and us in the "already but not yet" time, that time between his presence here on earth and his Second Coming at the end of the world. These last Sundays, bringing us to the end of the Church's liturgical year, ought to challenge us - even disturb us. While it is true that Jesus is meek and mild, boundlessly compassionate and merciful, and that he loves us unconditionally, it is likewise true that he has great and high expectations of us.

Some of us are clearly very gifted with valuable abilities, but there is no one, I would say absolutely no one, who can say he or she has been gifted with nothing. We may be especially talented in teaching children or cooking meals or repairing homes or farming or accounting. So, we should ask ourselves how we are using our particular gifts in the service of our parish community and the wider society.

God calls us to live in a world of abundance by taking risks and being generous. In addition to our homes and families, the best place to do this is in our parish. This means that we should be always willing to share our abilities in creative worship in the Church and engaging educational events in the Sunday school. We can fulfill needs we will find right in our parish: feeding the hungry, visiting the sick or the elderly, being Eucharistic ministers to the homebound, being greeters and ministers on Sundays and supporting liturgical initiatives with participation. I am sure there is a demand for every one of our talents in our parish community. I am very grateful because most of you are generous with talents, time and resources in serving our parish. I invite you all to step out from your comfort zones, with confidence, believing that every God-given gift we have is going to be exceedingly useful and fruitful for our parish community.

**This Thanksgiving**, I encourage you to take a moment to reflect on the goodness of God and the many ways in which he has blessed us. Let us give thanks for our families, our friends and our church community.
