PASTOR'S PEN

My Brothers and Sisters in the Lord,

There is so much about life that we cannot know ahead of time. There are so many things that are beyond our control or influence at any given moment. The weather is a perfect example of this. So much depends upon so many changing conditions that the best predictions often fail to materialize. Much the same can be said about our personal growth and development or that of our children and loved ones.

John, the son of Elizabeth and Zachariah, was, himself, a surprise. Born of a previously infertile couple, entitled to follow his father in the priestly ministry, John fled into the desert as a young teen and remained there for a score of years. When he finally emerged, he was inspired to preach and baptize. He was to prepare the way for God's Messiah.

Today is the beginning of the public life of Jesus. As you remember, Christmas is over, the child is grown up, the child becomes a man, and the man is baptized in the waters by John the Baptist. Today, we see John the Baptist testifying that Jesus indeed is the Son of God and the Son of man. Jesus is walking by him, and John, seeing him pass by, he says, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world."

John is telling his disciples that Jesus is the lamb who is the sacrificial lamb. This is the Messiah who does not come with great armies. This is the Messiah who comes to us as a sacrificial lamb and, as John says, who offers his whole life that sins might be forgiven.

Brothers and Sisters, these scriptures should encourage us as our life unfolds with its unforeseen surprises. We are on a journey - a pilgrimage. We hope and long for the Kingdom of Heaven. Yet, we cannot know or control all that we encounter from day to day, over the course of our years.

So, let our prayer be one of submission and trust. May we submit to all that God asks of us and may we trust that our greatest hopes will be fulfilled in the Eternal Life to come!

I will be leaving for India this Tuesday, January 17th, for home holidays and visa renewal. Please keep me in your loving prayers. Know, for sure, my blessings and prayers will be with you.

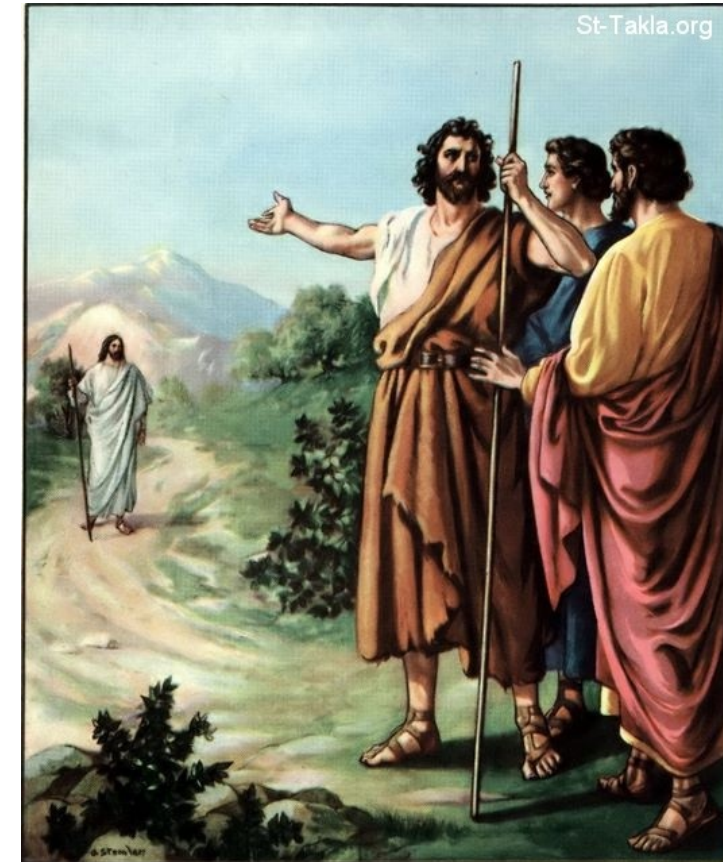

RESERVE TICKETS NOW FOR NATIONAL EUCHARIST CONGRESS: JULY 17-21, 2024

As part of the three-year Eucharistic Revival, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops will be holding a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, IN, on July 17-21, 2024. This event, primarily held at Lucas Oil Stadium in downtown Indianapolis, will feature times of adoration, speakers, prayer, and the celebration of Mass. The Diocese of Crookston was able to secure 250 tickets and the Diocesan Eucharistic Revival Committee is asking pastors to indicate how many tickets they wish to reserve for their parishioners by January 31st. If you wish to attend, please let your pastor know. The cost of each ticket is \$200, and participants will have additional costs for accommodations (we have not been given hotel rates), meals and transportation.

PRO-LIFE RESOURCES

Love Changes Everything is a free online formation program that includes 12 videos, support materials, and pastoral resources. It is a collaborative effort between the Sisters of Life, the McGrath Institute for Church Life at the University of Notre Dame, and CampCampo Films. Into Life is a new approach to pro-life ministry. Pro-life isn't about labels. Pro-life is about people. So much of the conversation about abortion is dominated by misconceptions and political rhetoric. Rooted in the wisdom of the Sisters of Life, this series introduces participants to new ideas for building a culture of life and solidarity, offers the opportunity for prayer and reflection, and develops and refines skills for accompanying women through an unexpected pregnancy.
